SPLASHING INTO SUMMER: WATER SAFETY

Whether your family is going to a pool, beach, lake or pond, knowing how to keep your children safe around water is key for a safe summer!

 Always supervise children around water.
Drowning is a leading cause of death in childhood, especially for children 1 to 4 years of age. Drowning risks and prevention measures change as children grow, but at all ages, multiple layers of prevention are needed.



- Drink plenty of water to avoid dehydration.
- Protect yourself from the sun. Wear sunglasses and apply sunscreen every 2 hours. It is recommended to use sunscreen with SPF 30 or higher.
- Avoid swimsuits that match the color of the water and lean towards bright, colorful suits to stand out.

STATEWIDE MOSQUITO TRAPPING AND TESTING

Statewide mosquito trapping and testing will start on June 2. The <u>Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station (CAES)</u> is the agency responsible for trapping, identifying, and testing mosquitoes for encephalitis viruses which includes West Nile Virus and Eastern Equine Encephalitis Virus. There are 108 trap sites in Connecticut and Meriden's trapping and testing location is at Falcon Park.
