

**ARTICLE XXXVIII
ADVISORY BOARD ON AGING**

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§ 6-180. Board Established

There is hereby created pursuant to Section C7-2 of the Meriden City Charter the Advisory Board on Aging,

§ 6-181. Membership

The Board shall consist of ~~nine~~^{thirteen} (9) members. All members shall be resident electors and shall be appointed in accordance with Section C3-3J of the Meriden City Charter, and may be removed by the City Council, for a term of two (2) years, except that of the first members appointed, four (4) shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year and five (5) shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years. Board members shall have an interest in the issues that affect Meriden's aging population. A member appointed to the Board to replace a member whose term has not expired shall be appointed for the unexpired term only. The Healthy Meriden 2010 Elderly Task Force, or the Elderly Task Force's successor, shall appoint a non-voting liaison to the Board.

§ 6-182. Election of Officers

At its first meeting, and annual thereafter at its April meeting, the Board shall elect from its members a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary.

§ 6-183. Meetings

The Board shall meet as often as it deems necessary, but no less than every three (3) months.

§ 6-184. Powers and Duties

The Advisory Board on Aging will advise and assist the Mayor and the City Council in the identification of issues that affect Meriden's aging population. The Board shall have such other powers and duties as may be assigned to it by the Mayor and/or the City Council.

§ 6-185. Quorum; rules of procedure

Except as otherwise provided specifically by statute, Charter or other legislation, a majority of the membership of the Board must be present to constitute a quorum, and a majority of those present and voting is required for action. The Board may establish such other rules of procedure as it deems necessary, provided that no such rule shall conflict with any other legislation.
