

Public Health Education

Save a Life: Overdose Education & Naloxone Training

This training is an essential part of overdose prevention education where participants learn what an overdose looks like and how to reverse one.

You will learn:

- → Signs & symptoms of an overdose
- → What naloxone (Narcan[®]) is and how to administer it
- ➔ Local resources and support

All attendees will receive a naloxone kit, certificate of completion, and other prevention resources. Training are FREE and open to Meriden residents and organizations.

Virtual Mental Health First Aid

The Meriden Department of Health and Human Services in partnership with Naugatuck Valley Health District is excited to offer a FREE Virtual Mental Health First Aid Training opportunity! The training will be split into two days (must attend both days) and is open to Meriden residents and community organization. The training will be held on Wednesday, June 11 and Thursday, June 12 from 9:00am – 12:00pm via Zoom.





Participants will be required to complete a 2-hour, self-paced online course before attending the virtual instructor-led sessions. Participants will receive certification from the National Council for Mental Wellbeing valid for 3 years.

Kindergarten Registration

Will your child be 5 years old by September 1, 2025? If so, your child is eligible to register for Kindergarten for the 2025-2026 school year! To start the registration process, please visit the Meriden Board of Education's Central Registration website:

Part of the registration process is meeting the State of Connecticut's health requirements. This includes:

- A physical examination within 12 months before the first day of school (August 28, 2024) AND
- A copy of the child's immunization record

Shingles Vaccine

Back to School Vaccination Clinic

Is your child starting or returning to school in the fall, and needs vaccines? We've got you covered! Our Public Health Clinic will be open until 6:00 pm on Tuesday, June 17, 2025. The State of Connecticut Department of Public Health requires certain vaccines for those entering kindergarten, 7th grade, or starting college. Coming Soon – Weekly Mosquito Testing Report from CAES

Statewide mosquito trapping and testing will be starting up again for the 2025 season! The Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station (CAES) is the state agency responsible for trapping, identifying, and testing mosquitoes for encephalitis viruses which includes West Nile Virus and Eastern Equine Encephalitis Virus. There are 108 trap sites in CT including one in Meriden located at Falcon Park. For information on Mosquito Prevention, please visit: www.meridenhealth.com.

Don't Let the Ticks Bite!

Ticks found on humans can be brought to our Environmental Health Office to be identified and tested for tickborne diseases such as Lyme disease, anaplasmosis, and babesiosis. Tick testing is offered by The Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station as a public service free of charge.
