# **HOMEOWNER'S TAX RELIEF:**

Am I Eligible & How Can I Apply?

### Local

- Applicant is 65 (by Dec. 31, 2019) or determined 100% permanently disabled and has been found eligible for SS disability benefits
- Must reside at the property permanently
- Max income \$42,500 (married) & \$35,200 (single)

#### State

- Applicant is 65 (by Dec. 31, 2019) or determined 100% permanently disabled and has been found eligible for SS disability benefits
- Must reside at the property permanently
- Max income \$45,100 (married) & \$37,000 (single)

\* If you are receiving any tax benefits in another town or state, you are not eligible to receive benefits in Meriden \*Tax credit amount is based on marital status and income.

#### Please visit Tax Assessors Office to apply. Last day to file is May 15, 2020 Applicants should bring their 2019 Federal Tax Return, Social Security 1099 and all year end statements. Applications are taken on the following days:

#### Veteran

- Filed discharge paperwork (DD214) with Required to present a letter from City Clerk
- Permanent resident of Meriden
- Property or motor vehicle owned by veteran or veteran's spouse
- Max income \$45,100 (married) & \$37,000 (single)
- 100% disabled veteran max income \$21,000 (married) & \$18,000 (single)

#### \* If you are receiving any tax benefits in another town or state, you are not eligible to receive benefits in Meriden \* Tax credit amount is based on marital status and income.

#### Please visit Tax Assessors Office to apply as soon as possible.

Applicants should bring their 2019 Federal Tax Return, Social Security 1099, all year end statement and any disability award letter.
